Reminders
Students are encouraged to bring a $I E A L E L I T$ snack from home. Please keep in mind that they will not have a lot of time for snack Something quick and easy is best. Make sure your child wears comfortable and safe shoes so that they are ready and able to participate in the activities we do throughout the day. Tennis shoes are recommended

Identify that folktale, fairy tales and fables are all part of the fictional genre, as well as explain the elements of fiction
Make personal connections with a well known-story or fable and explain the meaning of recurring phrases
Describe plot and retell a story: beginning, middle, and end, as well as describe character, reasons for their actions and feelings Make connections and infer and draw conclusions by providing evidence from the text as support


- Review the language of subtraction with opportunities to explore subtraction situations and develop conversation with words about subtraction
- Work with models that help relate subtraction to a missing part and begin working with equations for subtraction situations that allow students to explore related subtraction sentences using number bond ideas - composing and decomposing numbers to see addition and subtraction relationships within a number
- Connect addition and subtraction when using the language in stories involving "total" and "part"

write personal stories and add in elements of fiction such as imagined people, events, and ideas
- Use adjectives, adverbs, and time order transition words as part of getting their message across
- Use punctuation at the end of all
